An introduction to the political, economic and environmental issues of

for advanced Argentinian, Chilean and Colombian students

1 -14 February 2010

In co-operation with the ASKO EUROPA-STIFTUNG (AES) and other renowned partners in Germany, Chile and Colombia, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) offers scholarships for a two-week course dealing with the issue of the European Union in a broader sense. Two weeks, full of exciting opportunities for students - in the fields of law, politics, international relations, European studies or similar subjects - wanting to improve their understanding of contemporary European affairs and legislative regulations, organised by the AES, the European Academy of Otzenhausen and the DAAD.

The course is open to Argentinian, Chilean and Colombian undergraduates and graduates. The course will be held in English. The program is comprised of a course on European affairs and study trips to Saarbrücken (University, City) and Trier, to Luxembourg (European Court of Justice, City), to Strasbourg (European Parliament, Council of Europe in Strasbourg) and to Germany's former capital Bonn (visit to the DAAD).

Contents of the two-week program

- lectures on key issues of the European integration from renowned international experts
- professionally designed workshops
- field trips to Luxembourg, Strasbourg or Brussels

Purpose of this program

- supporting intercultural understanding by a weekend joint-seminar
- deepening knowledge of the EU and Europe's role in the world
- helping to create personal networks

Topics of the program

- Major Steps toward the European Union since 1950
- Integration and identity
- The EU as a global actor
- European Security and Defense Policy
- Decision-making procedures in the EU
- European energy policy and climate change
- Relations Europe-South America

All courses will be taught in English.

Scholarship

The cost of the program, accommodation at the European Academy of Otzenhausen (www.eao-otzenhausen.de), all meals and medical insurance for the time of the program (not for any private extensions) and all excursions are paid for by the DAAD (German Academic Exchange Service) and the AES. You must organize and pay for your own transport to Germany and back and whatever pocket money you might need. The DAAD will assist to the costs of your flight with EUR 690,00.

Eligibility Requirements

- Applications from advanced students of the following subjects will be accepted: European Studies, Law, Economics, Political Science, provided they have completed at least two years of university education at the beginning of the course and have academic interest in German and European affairs. Postgraduate and Ph.D. students may also apply.
- Applicants must be enrolled at a Chilean university.

- Applicants must not be younger than 19 years old at the beginning of the course.
- Applicants must prove sufficient knowledge of English to be able to participate in the programme, which will be taught in English.
